Administrative History:

Patrice Eileen Pratt was both in Akron, Ohio, USA on March 17, 1948. She was raised in Phoenix, Arizona from the age of seven to eighteen. In 1969, she immigrated to Canada, and attended the University of Manitoba in 1970. On November 27, 1974, Pratt became a naturalized Canadian Citizen. In Manitoba, Pratt worked with both the Manitoba Health Services Commission and the Manitoba Government Employees Association.

In the mid-1970s Pratt relocated to British Columbia where she worked with the British Columbia Government Employees' Union (BCGEU) from 1976 until 2007. She held several positions within the Union as committee chair and member, Staff Representative, Officer, and Director. Pratt was also involved in the B.C. Federation of Labour (BC Fed), including as Coordinator of Operation Solidarity in Victoria, B.C. in 1983. In February of 2007, Pratt retired from the BCGEU.

Scope/Content: The fonds mainly covers Pratt's union career and some of the major issues she was involved in, including the Charlottetown Accord, free trade, and women as union members. The collection includes union and related publications and several posters for progressive and labour events.

Union buttons and pins were transferred to BCLHC pin collection. One book was transferred to BCLHC library. Cassette tapes were transferred to BCLHC Audio Visual collection
