

The <u>Women's Labour History Virtual Walking Tour</u>, introduced in 2024, proved highly successful. This type of resource is frequently requested by unions, teachers and the heritage community.

We are committed to ensuring BC's labour history is never forgotten. Over the past two years, we <u>digitized 10,000</u> pages of union newspapers, now available online for free. Our team processes thousands of artifacts each year and partners with other institutions to preserve this vital legacy.





Historic Struggles, Modern Lessons

Our <u>Oral History Project</u> records firsthand stories from the people who have shaped BC's labour movement. Their unique perspectives have the power to grow unity and strength within the movement.

In 2024 we created a series of engaging short videos inviting union educators to empower classroom discussions in labour history. These bite sized <u>"Labour Heritage Moments"</u> showcase our oral history interviews and inspire dialogue and conversation at union events.

Dive deeper into labour history with "On the Line: Stories of BC Workers", a podcast featuring insightful stories and interviews, brought to you by the dedicated volunteers and staff of the BC Labour Heritage Centre. Six new episodes were released in 2024.


